BIAS AND CONSENT TRAINING - FORMAT UPDATE

Reconciling Works is committed to adapting to the needs of our Reconciling in Christ partners and our faithful supporters. We value your engagement and feedback. This is why after over a year of offering our online trainings, we have updated the accessibility and use of two of our four online training. Reconciling Works has launched a new format for the Bias & Its Impact on Welcome and Consent in Community Building trainings. Here's what you can expect from this new model.

Both trainings are pre-recorded and led by ReconcilingWorks staff, accompanied by a workbook to guide you through the materials. This new format will allow for an extended time with the materials in hopes of offering additional reflection and learning. The trainings can be taken individually, or with your larger faith community to discuss the ways bias and consent deeply impact the way you are in relationship with one another as people of faith. The recordings are 35 minutes in length and with group decision and workbook activities will take around 60 minutes to complete. They are a useful tool for learning, reflection, and action mapping.


PREPARING FOR ASSEMBLIES


