Early last month, I had the joy and delight of spending a week in Kansas and Missouri with the Central States Synod of the ELCA leading a time of professional development for their Rostered Leaders. The synod hosted the "Hearts Across the Heartland" training as part of their commitment to providing every Rostered Leader an opportunity to learn more about the diversity of people in their communities and congregations.

The leadership of the Synod staff and the planning team made this a time rooted in hospitability, welcome, and learning.

"We spent the day in theological reflection, graceful engagement, and hospitable curiosity as we sought to deepen and expand our awareness of how we can best see, name, and care for LGBTQLA+ people and their families in our ministry. In our time together, we learned why this conversation is important, terms and definitions, explored ways to provide thoughtful pastoral care and accompaniment, and rooted ourselves in the welcome reflected in the gospel.

Those in attendance sincerely appreciated the opportunity to grow our understanding and ability to welcome all. As a synod, we have committed to engage in this kind of learning and dialog, and as pastors, deacons, and synodauthorized ministers, we have responsibilities as leaders of the synod." - https://www.css-elca.org/workshops

Stories are an important part of how we share our faith. They deepen the ministry of ReconcilingWorks and ground us in the holy work of welcome we feel called to. We have been reaching out to folks like you to hear and share your story about how ReconcilingWorks and the RIC Program have impacted your life or faith community. This newsletter's "Stories of Hope" is from Cherri S. After attending the Building an Inclusive Church (BIC) training online, Cherri shares a story of hope with you today:

"I do not believe I would be a part of my congregation's RIC if it wasn't for our transgender daughter, who came out twenty months ago. As a lifelong member of the Lutheran church, I thought I was always welcoming in my words and actions. Looking back, I have found there were certainly times I did not exhibit through actions what my words were telling others. My daughter has taught me a great deal in acceptance, and I can certainly see why she currently does not feel welcome in coming to church. There is work that the congregation and I need to continue to do for the acceptance of all. My daughter has given me a second chance - this has all been with the Grace of God. I have seen our daughter become more confident and experienced increased communication with both myself and her father; unfortunately, that is something not all her friends experience with their families.

This transition with our daughter and connection with RIC, a workshop I attended last fall, and the BIC training with Ashlei have all been a blessing and a gift. I felt so incredibly welcome at the workshops through the stories and people I met. It has certainly given me an understanding that I honestly did not have to think about before. The BIC training on January 7th of this year was fantastic, and I felt so comfortable sharing my story in that space. I love the comment one of the attendees gave during the training about the Gospel being a "Gospel of second chances;" this is something I continue to reflect on.

Thank you for allowing me to share my story here in whatever is best to serve others, for it is all about love and acceptance for all."

## EXPANDED RIC PARTNER PUBLIC COMMITMENTS UPDATE

ReconcilingWorks 1,010 RIC partners have been hard at work updating their partner commitments, learning ways to deepen and expand welcome in their faith communities, and setting new milestones to encourage ongoing education and growth. In addition, the 294 faith communities on a journey of discernment have been accompanying their community to learn what intentional and explicitly welcome will look like in their unique and diverse contexts.

RIC Partner Public Commitment:

To be recognized as a Reconciling in Christ (RIC) Partner, your faith community will:

- 1. Explicitly state a welcome to people of "all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions" or "LGBTQIA+" and name its commitment to "racial equity" or "anti-racism" in its welcome statement.
- 2. Be open to calling an LGBTQIA+ and Black, Brown, Indigenous, Person of Color (BIPOC) Rostered Leader.
- 3.Allow community space/sanctuary to be used for LGBTQIA+ weddings and blessings.
- 4. Make a meaningful contribution annually to support the national RIC program.
