TRANSGENDER

**a person whose self-experienced gender
identity does not match the sex they
were assigned at birth**



QUEER

**a person who is a part of the LGBTQIA+ community;
used as a form of affirmation and liberation**

“Queer” can be used as either an umbrella term, or as someones individual sexual orientation, gender identity or expression.

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INTERSEX

**a person who was born with a combination of
male and female biological traits**

Lesbian people can express themselves in many ways! The orange colors in the flag represent trans and non-binary lesbians.

LESBIAN

a female-identifying person who is attracted to other female-identified individuals



GAY

**a male-identifying person who is attracted to
other male-identified individuals**

NON-BINARY

**a person who does not identify exclusively
as a man or a woman**

PANSEXUAL

a person who is attracted to others regardless of their sex assigned at birth, gender identity, or gender expression

Pansexuality, or “Pan” for short, can sometimes be under the umbrella of “bisexuality.”



GENDERQUEER

a person who does not subscribe to conventional gender distinctions, but identifies with neither, both, or a combination of male and female genders

If you happen to use the wrong pronouns for someone, a helpful response would be, “Sorry, and thank you for correcting me! I’ll be sure to use your pronouns next time.”



AGENDER

**a person who does not identify themselves
as having a particular gender**

ALLY

**any person who is straight, or cis-gender who
is supportive of the LGBTQIA+ community**

AROMANTIC

a person whose sexual orientation is characterized by a lack of romantic attraction toward a person of any gender

People on the ARO spectrum can be of any sexual orientation! That means folx who are queer or straight can identify as aromantic.



Being ACE can be different for every person. If someone you know identifies as asexual, you can extend some care by saying, “Thanks! Can you share more about what that means for you?”



ASEXUAL

a person whose sexual orientation is characterized by a lack of sexual attraction toward a person of any gender

BISEXUAL

a person whose sexual or romantic attraction is not limited to people of one particular gender

Singer Dodie once shared in her “Coming Out Song,” how being bisexual to her means “I have a heart that could love plural genders!”
